

# TEENS LEARN TO DRIVE



**The Sweet Life Road Show** is a hands-on interactive experience that raises teens' awareness about the deadliest road risks, and shows them simple strategies to stay safe.



This all-day event is offered free of charge to high schools across Ontario. It uses methods such as computer gaming and peer theatre to go beyond drivers education classes and teach beginner drivers to make safe and strategic decisions.

**Crashes are the #1 cause of death and injury for Ontario teens, yet they are nearly 100% preventable.**

## Event Schedule

### Morning

#### Strategy Stations

Students are divided into small groups, and circulate around 10 stations addressing issues such as:

- Dealing with distractions while driving
- What to say when a friend is driving recklessly
- How to share the road with trucks
- Dealing with roadside emergencies
- What to do when you become drowsy while driving
- What is considered to be a "safe place" to pull over
- *And much more!*

### Afternoon

#### Taking Action on Distractions

Distractions - including texting - are some of the biggest threats to drivers today. This portion of the event uses hand-held simulators and audience polling to convince students to focus solely on driving, and to teach students how to deal with distracted drivers.

#### Weeding Out the Risks

There is a lot of misinformation about the effects of marijuana on driving. This session addresses common myths to prove that drugged driving is dangerous, illegal, and detectable.
